Committee of the Whole Meeting

David Hewko presented to the Board the recently completed North Peace Sub-Regional Recreation Inventory and Assessment.

Alaska Highway Heritage Project

The Alaska Highway Community Society (AHCS) Heritage Consultant, Julie Harris updated the Board about the status of the Alaska Highway Heritage Project. The Alaska Highway Community Society (AHCS) in BC and the Alaska Highway Heritage Society (AHHS) in Yukon are completing work to nominate the Alaska Highway Corridor as a National Historic Site of Canada (NHSC) in time for the 75th Anniversary of the Alaska Highway and the 150th Anniversary of Confederation.

Residents of the Old Fort and Site C Dam

The residents of the Old Fort live approx. 8,000 feet downstream from the proposed Site C Dam. Residents requested that the Board of the PRRD pass a resolution to incorporate the mitigation and compensation measures into their negotiation with BC Hydro, based on concerns about dam safety, worker camp safety and security, traffic congestion, nuisance and disturbance, loss of land values and pollution.

CAO Chris Cvik will work with the Regional District's solicitor to identify areas where the Regional District can assist property owners, within its mandate as a local government.

Charlie Lake Sewage Local Service Area Parcel Tax Roll Direction and Imposition Bylaw No. 2195,

The Charlie Lake Sewage Service Establishment Bylaw No. 678 requires that the entire cost borrowing for the sewage system shall be recovered by levying a parcel tax on land benefitting from the system. With the debt now paid off, an amended parcel tax bylaw was approved to allow for ongoing maintenance and upgrade of the System. The years for which a single amount of \$150 per parcel shall be imposed are 2015-2035.

Contract Award

The Landfill Gas Management System Monitoring contract was awarded to Hoban Construction Ltd., in the amount of \$25,875.

New Building Canada Fund Applications

Staff was approved to submit an application to redesign the North Peace Regional Landfill front entrance.

The Board will write letters of support for submissions being made by the City of Dawson Creek, the Prespatou Farmers Institute and the District of Chetwynd.

Zoning amendment

The Board adopted the Dennis and Janice Large zoning amendment to rezone the property from R-5 (Residential 5 Zone) to R-4 (Residential 4 Zone) and to amend the minimum from 1.8 ha (4.5 acres) parcel size to 1.6 ha. (4.0 acres) to subdivide the subject property to three parcels.

Presentation



The Board presented Karen Goodings a canvas print, Keeper of the Peace by Don Hoffmann.

Chair Ackerman said during the presentation, "Keeper of the Peace is a reflection of her service as the Chair of the Peace River Regional District and the Peace River Regional Hospital District from 1998 to 2014. As Chair, you represented the Peace River Regional District on local, provincial and national issues with determination and grace."

RCMP invited to attend a future meeting

The RCMP will be invited to discuss the delivery and financing of police services in the region. An important element in the delivery of police services is to provide a good understanding of how the Province, municipalities, regional district and the RCMP work together in the Province.
