Introduction

The Seniors Aging in Place (SAIP) Program offers support to help individuals live independently at home.

The program is available to residents who are 65 years or older and residing within Electoral Area D and portions of Electoral Area E within the Peace River Regional District.

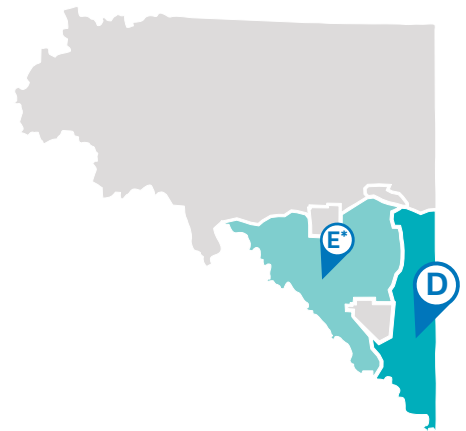
SAIP is funded and administered by the Peace River Regional District (PRRD). The services are delivered by Dawson Creek Society for Community Living (DCSCL).

Seniors often prefer to stay in their homes as they age, a concept known as “aging in place.” This is especially true in rural areas where they have built and maintained their homes, raised families and created lasting memories. These homes hold precious memories and serve as important gathering spots for generations. It’s no surprise that seniors prefer to remain in these beloved spaces as they grow older.

Support for Aging in Place

The SAIP program offers tools to help seniors stay in their homes longer. It addresses common challenges such as access to healthy meals, help with household chores, social isolation and mobility issues during harsh winters.

History

The Seniors Aging in Place program was developed following two trial programs in 2020 and 2021, which highlighted the need to support rural seniors in Electoral Area D and parts of Electoral Area E.

The study identified snow removal, housekeeping and assistance with meals as the priority needs.

In July 2021, following a favourable region-wide referendum, the Regional Board of the Peace River Regional District adopted the Seniors Aging in Place Support Services Establishment Bylaw. The program was implemented with provision of in-home support services contracted to a qualified third party.

In November 2021, a Request for Proposal led to the Dawson Creek Society for Community Living being selected to continue delivering these essential services.

Founded in 1958, DCSCCL leverages its vast experience and skilled staff to effectively support the evolving needs of seniors and people with disabilities in the community, ensuring they can live independently at home for as long as possible.

As of 2026, DCSCCL remains the service provider, demonstrating its ongoing commitment to enhancing the quality of life for seniors in the region.

In-Home Support Services



Healthy Meals

\$8.57 per meal, per person*

Five freshly frozen home-cooked meals delivered weekly, with a customizable menu that includes over 20 curated options such as:

- Roast beef with mashed potatoes, vegetables and gravy
- Shepherd's pie
- Ham with scalloped potatoes and vegetables
- Chili
- Cabbage rolls
- Beef or chicken stir-fry
- Baked chicken with rice and vegetables

Seniors are free to choose and submit their preferences weekly. Food allergies and special food requirements such as gluten-free and are available upon request.

Meals are delivered on a prearranged day with a delivery contractor, who also performs a social check and socializes during each visit.

"Meals are just the perfect size. I'm diabetic so they are perfect for nutrition."





Housekeeping

\$61.60 per bi-weekly two-hour visit*

Two professionals clean each home for two hours per visit, on a bi-weekly basis. The contractor provides the labour and necessary cleaning supplies, equipment and products required.

A social component is involved as many seniors experience loneliness and look forward to these visits while receiving help to complete household chores.



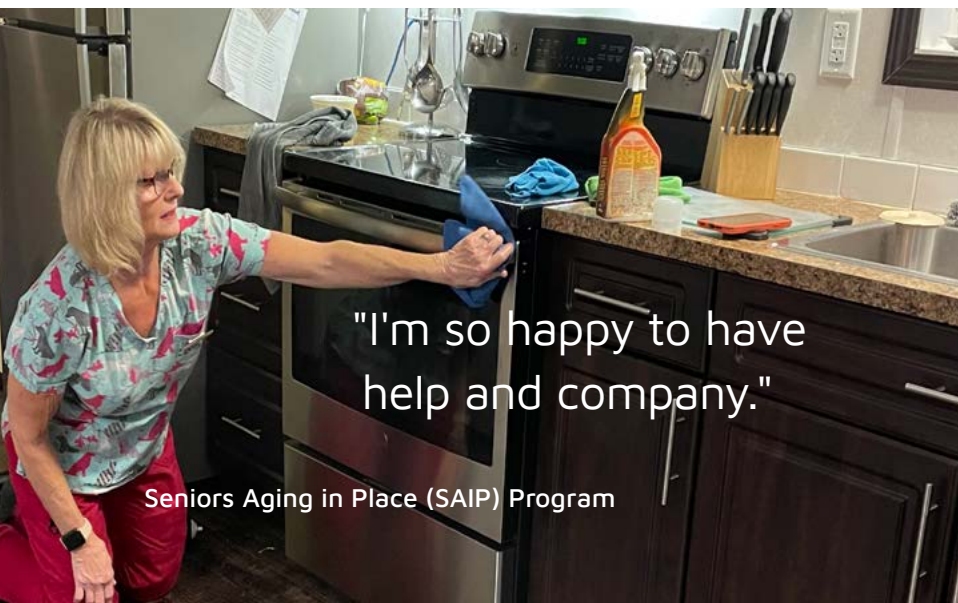
Home Maintenance, Snow Removal

\$80.34 per service*

(Max. 15 snowplow services per season)

A contractor completes snow removal at each subscribed home up to three times a month. The snow removal services are available from November to March.

Seniors Aging in Place (SAIP) Program



Eligibility & Application Process

The Seniors Aging in Place program is available to residents who are 65 years of age or older, and residing in Electoral Area D and portions of Electoral Area E.

Electoral Area D includes the following communities:

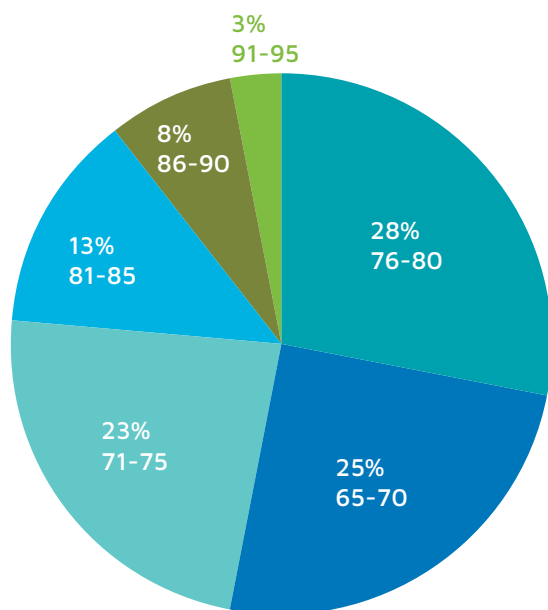

Program Enrollment: As of October 2024

The number of seniors in the program increased from 120 to 277 since 2022. This represents about three percent of the 1,300 seniors aged 65 or older in Areas D and E identified by the 2021 Canadian Census.

The majority of enrolled seniors are receiving one or more of the in-home support services with most in the 76 to 80 years old category.

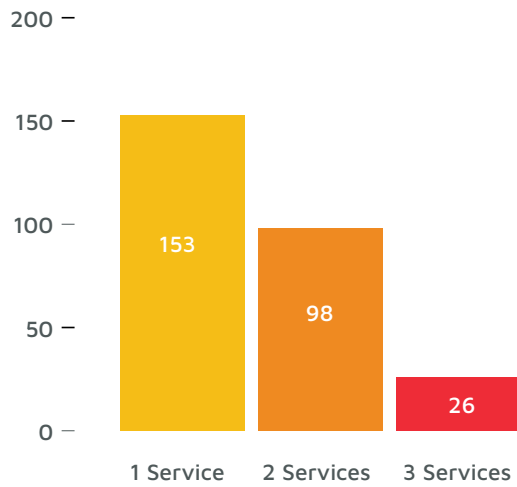


Program enrollment by age group

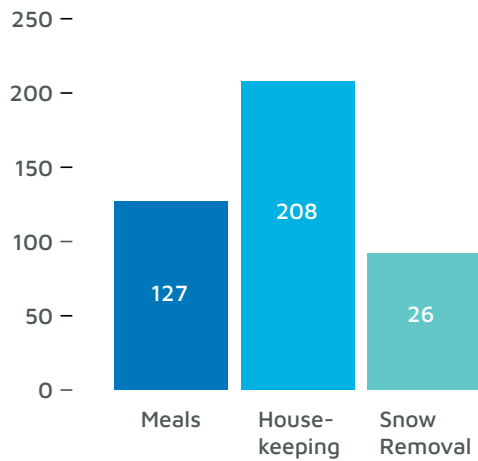
Number of seniors:
